Due to the death of his father in Tennessee, blues artist Lesley Farnell will not appear tonight at the Summer Lights Festival as scheduled. The Artists Records artist will be replaced on the bill by the popular Nashville blues band The Nationals. In another scheduling shift, the In-Group will not appear on the Nashville Network/CBS Records show as previously announced. A spokeswoman for CBS said yesterday that the Grammy-winning, Georgia-based folk duo had never committed itself to the show, despite being advertised by the Metro Arts Commission.

Organ-to-cheek tribute to the King with *What Would Elvis Do?* and Karen Shelby led a full-fledged country rag here.

Later in the evening at the court-house, soulful Russell Smith rocked into his Amazing Rhythm Aces hit *The End Is Not in Sight* before moving on to his more recent solo material. Another country soul man, T. Graham Brown, was to end the first night of music at the festival's biggest stage.

Festivalgoers gorged on a variety of food — from the typical festival fare like hot dogs, pretzels and cotton candy, to hard-to-find food such as fajitas and barbecued chicken. A new ticketing policy required hungry festival attendees to purchase tickets for the food at various booths. The tickets were then redeemed at the food vendors.

The celebrities weren't all on stage. Fred and Wilma Flinstone of *Bedrock* and kiddie elephant king Babar mingled with young and old alike.

And a long line of attendees at least attempted to make stars of themselves at the Nashville Network booth. Nashville's Mike Ryzides and Susan Hahn, 5-year-old Stephen Hahn, Bill and Susan Hightower and 3-year-old Will Hightower sang together energetically, if not entirely tunelessly, along with Dolly Parton's 9 to 5.

Leaving the booth with a tape of their performance in hand, the singers pronounced themselves well
