### College Scholarships That Go Begging

DEAR MARTHA: I would appreciate your giving me as much information as possible as to how the child of a deceased World War II veteran might obtain financial aid to send him through college. I was told that many scholarships offered through labor unions go unused annually, and I wonder who might qualify for these scholarships.

I realize these questions have been answered previously in your column, but hope you won't mind repeating the answers.

GO TO THE EDUCATION division of the main Public Library, Thirteenth and Olive Streets, and ask to see the several directors of financial aid for students. A new one has just crossed my desk, "Federal Dollars for Scholars." It reports that 36 government agencies sponsor 40 separate programs to provide assistance to individuals seeking opportunities in education, research or training.

A SOLDIER, WHETHER he is an officer or an enlisted man, normally does not get leave to the United States unless there is an emergency at home. Leaves from Vietnam normally are for seven days. That is why most families who would leave together meet in Hawaii, Hong Kong or Australia. Longer leaves are up to a commander's discretion. It costs \$200 economy fare and \$100 first-class fare between Saigon and San Francisco round trip. You can go space-available on military aircraft, but that's pretty chancy. Of course, there is available 30-day leaves, with government transportation provided, for officers and enlisted men who extend at least six months over their normal year in Vietnam.

DEAR JERRY: After being deferred from the draft while in the Peace Corps my son has been reclassified 1A. He is a graduate student and can request a 2S classification that will remain in effect until the end of the school year in June. However, he will reach his 26th birthday before then. Does this mean that his service is delayed until after June or does becoming 26 before that relieve him of his draft obligation?

YOUR SON'S CLASSIFICATION won't be changed to 2S under the rules. But as a 1A he is allowed to complete his graduate school year without being called. If his draft number should come up before he reaches age 26, and he passes his physical exam, he would still have to go after his school year ends. If his number doesn't come up before he reaches 26 he is free.

DEAR JERRY: Please tell me how a World War II veteran and his wife can be buried in a national cemetery. When and with whom do you make the arrangements? -J.A., Pacific, Mo.

IT'S BEST TO HAVE the funeral director make the arrangements with the superintendent of a national cemetery because they have to co-ordinate details. This is done as soon as practicable after either the veteran or his wife dies, not before. If she dies first, she may be buried in a national cemetery with the understanding that the veteran will be buried beside her. The funeral director should, if possible, be given the name of the military service involved, the veteran's grade and service number. The date and place of entering service, the date and place of separation from service. The fuller the information the easier it is for cemetery officials to check with the record centers of the services involved. The funeral director should be told if you will arrange for a minister or want the cemetery to, or if military honors are desired. At some national cemeteries military personnel are not available and local veterans groups arrange for the military honors.
