## Montoya Concert Tonight

What happens when Carlos Montoya sits down to play his concert at Municipal Auditorium Wednesday at 8 p.m. he begins his 20th season as the world's leading flamenco guitarist, and a number of VIP's will join the audience in celebrating this silver anniversary event.

Tuesday night Montoya became an "Honorary Texan" completely with an official certificate presented personally by Gov. Preston Smith who also played a custom-made, personalized silver-grip Texas Sotomayor in the lead of the veterans performer who was born in Madrid, Spain, some 66 years ago.

The reception, attended by a black to crowd of more than 300 at the Villa Regina, included Montoya's old friend, world famous flamenco dancer Jose Greco who presented Montoya with a silver plaque commemorating his concert season anniversary.

Other guests included Austin Symphony conductor Lawrence Smith, Austin Civic Ballet director Eugene Slavin, University of Texas music department chairman Robert Roy, flamenco guitarist El Curro, the "Threadgild" and other music and arts personalities, including Anita.
