In other news, Merle Haggard's "Are the Good Times Really Over For Good" and Rosanne Cash's "I Wonder" music videos have both been nominated for awards in the first annual "American Video Awards" ceremony to be held next month in Los Angeles. Both fall into the category of "Best Country Video."

The inclusion of the Haggard clip, at least, in that category is no surprise, since it was produced by Terry Lickona and directed by Allan Muir and Marc Ball.
