DALLAS (UPI) — Dallas Cowboys President Tex Schramm says he is upset because authorities have not resolved a federal drug investigation that allegedly has implicated five of the team's players.

Schramm said federal authorities first agreed not to prosecute the players on cocaine possession charges if they entered a "pretrial diversion" program, but now are thinking of filing charges.

He identified the players as defensive end Harvey Martin, running back Tony Dorsett, wide receiver Tony Hill, running back Ron Springs and defensive end Larry Bethea.

"I'm unhappy about it. This is something that's been going on for a year, and it's still not resolved," Schramm was quoted in a story in the Sunday edition of the Dallas Times Herald.

STAMP QUEEN: Britain's Queen Elizabeth owns the finest stamp collection in the world. Even John Marriott, her keeper of the stamps, doesn't know how many stamps are in the royal collection. But there's sad news for other collectors.

"The queen won't swap," is the way Connoisseur magazine quotes a top British philatelist. She does lend, though — to the Royal Philatelic Society every September. British monarchs appear on many stamps, but a New Brunswick 1860 five-cent stamp in the queen's collection does not display the head of Queen Victoria.

Instead it depicts the province's postmaster-general, Charles Connell. Queen Victoria was not amused. Connell probably wasn't either — he was fired.
