

The Country Dinner Playhouse brings these characters to life in the joyfully irreverent musical comedy "Do

Black Patent Leather Shoes Really Reflect Up?"

The show was presented by the Playhouse last year and was so popular that director Bill McHale decided to bring it back. It runs through July 29.

As the title suggests, "Patent Leather Shoes" explores the two major subjects in a Catholic boy's life: religion and girls - and not necessarily in that

(According to the character Sister Lee, girls shouldn't wear patent leather shoes because they reflect up, and they shouldn't wear white pearls because they reflect down.)

Brian Walker stars as Eddie Ryan, a man reminiscing on a childhood as a confused underachiever in a Catholic school.

His memories have altered some of the specifics. The students' desks, for example, are recalled as bright orange

scooters that the kids race around on. But Ryan's childhood fears and insecurities are conjured fresh and true.

Based on John Power's book of the same name, "Patent Leather Shoes" pokes fun at nuns and priests, but still acknowledges them as human and three-dimensional.

The play explores such serious issues as the meaning of religion and the pain of rejected love, but treats them with a light touch and enough fine singing and dancing to keep the audience smiling.
